Alpha Youth on Zoom:

Sunday 15th November witnessed the launch of Alpha Youth on Zoom. The team and I agreed that the best way to enable age relevant discussion effectively and safely was to create two individual Zoom groups thereby eliminating the need for break out rooms.

So, we launched Alpha Youth Group 1 (which starts at 09:45 - 10:45) for young people in school year 5 and 6 (there are eight young people in this group). And Alpha Youth Group 2 (which starts at 11:00 - 12:00) for young people in school year 7+, (there are three young people in this group).

In continued consultation with the team we decided to keep the content of the sessions the same as in-person delivery. Which is:

- Registration
- Welcome/Notices
- Game 1
- The video & discussion
- God space an opportunity for the young people to encounter God for themselves
- Final challenge.

At 9:15am the team and I "signed in" so that we could have a briefing meeting and time of prayer before the week's session: Cross: Why did Jesus die? For our first week on Zoom, the team and I were delighted, to see an almost full complement of young people: seven in the first, younger age group and three in the elder age group.

My fear was that the content may not fill the hour on Zoom, but the opposite transpired! In the first group we only managed to get through half of the session due to the depth and quality of questions and discussion.

Whilst we also ran out of time, and overran, for the second group and had to miss out God space and the final challenge. All in all, these two groups on Zoom were a great success and the team and I were delighted by the outcome of the sessions and are looking forward to this week.

This Sunday's themes will be:

- 1. Group 1: concluding the session on the Cross: why did Jesus die?
- 2. Group 2: will be exploring the topic of Faith: How can I have faith?
