Today's Reflection is from Mike Wilson – Thanks Mike!

In Isaiah 50:7 the Suffering Servant, Jesus, says "Because the Sovereign Lord helps me, I will not be disgraced. Therefore have I set my my face like flint, and I know I will not be put to shame." Similarly, today's gospel reading has Jesus about to "resolutely set out for Jerusalem". Literally, He was 'setting his face to Jerusalem' (Luke 9:51). Usually, it would take 3 days to walk from Galilee to Jerusalem. Jesus took some 6 months as he continued his busy ministry in Judea before arriving at what he knew would be his final destination, the Holy City of King David. He had earlier told His disciples that He"must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and He must be killed and on the third day raised to life" (Luke 9:22). On each step of this journey Jesus knew that when He eventually reached Jerusalem it was to face an unjust and cruel death.

Jesus had to be determined, resolute and courageous to obey the Father by giving up His life and paying the price for our sins. This was to be no 'stroll in the park' lecture tour for our Lord. It was to be an obedient march towards certain death. This was inescapable if He was to complete His rescue mission and enable sinful men and women to come back to God. We too must face up to the fact that our lives will end in certain death. Our departures will doubtless be less brutal and unjust than that of Jesus. We can trust Him never to ask us to go through anything that He has not already experienced for our sake. If we are to be raised to eternal life with God, we too need to set our faces like flint, to obey God with unflagging determination and courage. Jesus said, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life must lose it, but whoever loses it for me will save it (Luke 9:23-24). Let's



respond by using this robust Graham Kendrick song as a prayer right now. May each one of us 'fight on through until we see Jesus face to face!' He will be alongside us each step of our way.
