ST JOHN'S FAMILY NEWS

Pilgrimage to the Hebridean island of Iona 14-23rd April 2023 by Siriol Seabrook

A chance invitation to a talk, spotted in Susie's church newsletter in November 2021, about a proposed pilgrimage, led to a most memorable week on the Hebridean island of Iona.

The initial, illustrated presentation, held at Westbourne Parish Church by the rector, Revd Andrew Doye and his wife, Karen, inspired me. It showed a detailed timetable for the proposed visit together with slides of amazing sea and landscapes, showing limpid blue water and white sandy beaches all bathed in sunshine, taken during their "recce" earlier in the year.

"Mull"ing it over with Roy, he pointed out that there was possibly an ancestor of mine buried on the island, and combined with Ben Fogle's programme "Scotland's Sacred Islands" recounting the legacy of St Columba whose arrival in 563AD, had an influence on the establishment of Christianity throughout western Europe, we decided it was an opportunity not to be missed.

We left Westbourne Friday morning, stopping at Carlisle overnight. Once we had left Carlisle on the Saturday morning, the scenery became spectacular as snow-peaked mountains towered above dark lochs. At Oban we said goodbye to our jovial driver, Mervyn and had a welcome couple of hours stopover in the lively port full of bagpipe players, whilst we waited for the ferry for the ³/₄-hr crossing to Craignure on Mull. After a crab salad, Roy and I climbed up to McCabe's tower above Oban with breath-taking views across to the island of Mull. The accommodation for our group of 23 overlooked the Sound of Iona and was a mere ten-minute walk from the Abbey. In the heart of the house, was the beautiful St Columba's Chapel in which Andrew held services morning and evening early enough for "pilgrims" to attend the Iona community services in the Abbey. He also organised walks most days across Iona and a 7-miler on Mull with spectacular views out to sea and the outlying islands. Apart from the first day's rain, we were so lucky with the weather which was fine and sunny all week. One afternoon, Karen organised a boat trip to Staffa to see Fingal's cave, seals and after climbing to the top of Staff saw the razorbill puffins floating in their hundreds on the blue water below.

On some afternoons, drawing classes were organised by fellow pilgrims, Norma and Denis kindly supplying all the necessary art materials. Roy and I had a go at drawing the abbey. "Pilgrims" were free to come and go and join in activities as they wished.

Most evenings there were something on offer in the lounge including a variety of quizzes and on the last night a fun musical evening including recitations. Steve, a talented guitarist formed a group which he named "Pilgrims Regress" including Roy on harmonica and tin whistle and I singing a few Scottish-Irish folksongs.

Andrew's final "pilgrim" service was outside overlooking Mull when we had to think of a word to encapsulate our feelings of the week and mine was "Fellowship" and a sense of community. On return to Oban, however, no coach! The company had mistaken the date of our departure for the following day. So ended up with a train journey through the Trossachs National Park withawe-inspiring views. The coach collected us at 8 am on Sunday morning and we were back in Westbourne by 7 pm that evening. As Andrew said "a pilgrimage is the going to somewhere unfamiliar as an exercise of discovery, not only of the place but also of one's self".


