Message from Matt:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am sure we are disappointed, but unsurprised that we are about to enter another lockdown. In their letter to clergy the Archbishops of Canterbury and York and the Bishop of London lament the loss of gathered worship. While this is not now possible they recall us to the 'fundamental spiritual disciplines that shape our Christian life.'

Two particular disciplines are important, Henri Nouwen describes them as Solitude and Community.

In solitude we can put aside time just to be silent with God. It may help to have a few words of scripture, though it isn't study, a prayer - though it isn't a list to go through; it could be a few words from your favourite song, or just be outdoors in creation. But it is time to let the distractions and chaos of life settle so that we can be more aware of God's presence through the Holy Spirit. It will be hard at first. We are easily unsettled at the moment and distractions can help hide the unsettledness in our souls. But persevere and you should become more aware of God in you and you in God, as Jesus himself prayed, John 17:20-23

In Community we share when we listen together. We belong to the body of Christ. it is made up of many people and we need not be alone. For those groups that have been meeting, carry on! We can share what we feel, what we are learning from Scripture, what we need. Be open with one another, be a good listener, and be authentic. Although we cannot be physically together, a phone call, a letter or card, a small gift dropped off or a virtual chat over coffee or something stronger, makes the difference. I am glad we studied 2 Timothy, we see Paul valued the things his friends could do for him, without being there.

...we know that suffering produces perseverance, perseverance, character, and character, Hope. And Hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us. Rom 5:4-5

Message from the Treasurer – Alan McNeill

Introducing the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS):

"Each one must do just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." 2 Cor 9:7

Thank you for your financial support of St Johns during this very difficult time. We really appreciate your commitment. As you know, the church is not free and your regular giving keeps us running. From last year's accounts the church costs $\pounds 13,500$ a month with the largest items being our payment to the diocese of $\pounds 6,000$ a month and $\pounds 3,000$ a month for staff salaries.

The Parish Giving Scheme has been introduced by the Diocese as a better way to give to St Johns church regularly. You have the option to donate monthly, quarterly or annually.

You also have the option to give linked to the rate of inflation so your donation is "inflation proofed".

If you are a tax payer then PGS claims the Gift Aid monthly, 25 per cent added to your giving, directly for us. That saves a huge amount of our administrative effort and improves our cash flow.

If you do not pay tax, please enroll in PGS as your way of regularly supporting the work of St Johns.

The scheme is paid for by our Diocese. St Johns PCC has voted to introduce the scheme to church members and have taken the lead with enrolling in the scheme. Their feedback has been positive; it is easy to complete the form and send it off. You can increase or decrease your giving at any time.

Please consider prayerfully how much you give. The last thing we want is for you to get into financial difficulties.
