Working at height - cleaning	<ul> <li>Staff</li> <li>Volunteers</li> <li>Visitors</li> </ul> Injury from falling from a height or injury from an object falling from height when: <ol> <li>cleaning internal windows and ledges</li> <li>cleaning gutters</li> <li>cleaning fixtures and fittings above head height</li> </ol>	Staff and Volunteers informed no ladders to be used  Cleaner to work from ground level using, for example, long duster - instruction given  Gutter guards fitted  Contractor used if task not safely accessible from ground level	Engage suitable contractor for working at any height above 1m or where the risk deems it necessary  Provide specific working at height training to staff & volunteers that need to work at height (under 1m), review yearly	Cleaner Standing Committee Contractor where required	Ongoing
