MESSAGES FROM MATT

Worship in Church

Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

I am sure you are aware that Covid guidance and restrictions will be removed very soon.

This could affect us and how confident you feel about attending church and what we can and cannot safely do in two main ways, wearing masks and communion. Standing Committee discussed both of these and believe we should share our ideas before we make any changes.





Masks Anyone can wear a mask if they want to. But, wearing masks inhibits a person's ability to sing freely and also to lip read if that helps understand someone who is speaking. We would like to give you the freedom to not wear a mask.

However, some people may still feel vulnerable and so we will separate seats at the back for people who might feel uncomfortable to come in and want to wear a mask. They may feel safer still if they came in last and went out first.

We would like to know what you think about this.

Communion. We do not think sharing a common cup is a good idea and the C of E is not allowing alternative proposals. I have colleagues who are intincting wafers in the communion wine before giving them to people receiving communion. Practically, the edge of the wafer is dipped in the wine by me, or the priest taking communion. No-one should be intincting their own wafer. There should be enough wafer for you to take it between your finger and thumb or place it in your hand. Wafers should not become soggy or sticky. If my fingers touch someone's hand, then I will quickly clean with anti-bac, in case they forgot to anti-bac on entering church. This seems straightforward. However, if you prefer to not to that you will need to let us know.

PCC UPDATE

The PCC is working very hard on your behalf, please continue to pray for them and all the activities. Here is a brief summary of the more interesting items from the last PCC meeting, held 24th November. The full minutes are always available via the Church Office.

1. <u>Church refurbishment</u>. This is continuing well, and we hope the major works should be complete by about Christmas. There will then be quite a bit of minor works, clearing up etc, before we can re-open the church.

2. <u>Children's and families work.</u> Richard and Kim continue to be very active, despite Covid. The Sunday family service, being held at Chidham School, is well attended, with new families coming.

Friday Fellowship is popular with 25-30 people attending, a relaxing end to the week for children and parents.

SYG is starting at St John's centre for our Youth Group.

Plans are well underway for a Christmas trail.

3. There is a lot of work on safeguarding and in particular recruiting volunteers. This will affect everyone who volunteers for the church, we are working on the details.

4. <u>A passion for life</u>. This is an exciting opportunity to join the national evangelism campaign, which will culminate at Easter 2022. There will be training events in the New Year.

5<u>. Climate Sunday</u> Following our focus on this, a group is getting together to help the church, and all of us, reduce our environmental impact and live more sustainably.

6. <u>St Nicholas, Thorney have had their regular building inspection (Quinquennial inspection) which flags up repair work needed etc.</u>

7. <u>Finance</u> The PCC has agreed to the Diocese's parish share request for 2022, a 3% increae on last year.

8. <u>Health and safety.</u> There is a new risk assessment for working at height: please do not climb on anything, ask if you can't reach something.

This week we're looking at Jesus' identity when he walks on the water.



HOME COMPOSTING.FINAL INSTALMENT.
Garden compost is better than bagged compost, some of which contain peat, which should be avoided.
Around 40% of your dustbin contents could be suitable for home composting.
Air is vital but the structure should allow this, eg using scrunched paper, twigs and prunings.
Not too many grass cuttings.
Remember to mix ingredients, using roughly equal "green"

Turn the compost and use from the bottom. Look forward to a dark brown, crumbly texture, pleasant smelling compost
