Australian Evangelical Graeme Goldsworthy summarised the Bible in his short account, According to Plan. In it, he describes the Creation, The Fall and Restoration that God brings through Jesus Christ in terms we can easily share.

The climactic act, however, is Jesus' earthly ministry which Goldsworthy describes as..

'Grieving and angered, the kina undertakes an unusual campaign of reconquest: he infiltrates the rebel lands he is and announces reestablishing his reign. Wherever he travels, he defeats the rebel forces with provocative demonstrations of love and justice. He restores harmony and wholeness. He triumphs in the decisive battle, not by an overwhelming show of force but by offering reconciliation to the rebel forces through a surprising demonstration of humility and selfsacrifice.'

It is this ministry, with its powerful impact that Jesus is brought to trial for. In response to Pilate's questions, Jesus answered,

"My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world."

John 18:36

And that for me is the centre of it. The Kingdom is not 'of this world.' Whatever ethical and political beliefs we have, worthy though they might be, they are not close to the love and justice of God's kingdom. The kingdom doesn't assert itself over those who need saving. These phrases from Goldsworthy put it well. In 'An unusual campaign of reconquest.... He triumphs.....not by an overwhelming show offorce.....demonstration of humility and self-sacrifice'. These are all things we respond to. We know we are proud, rebellious and selfish and are grateful for Christ's grace in coming to save us from those sins, and others and the penalty he bore on the cross.

However, it doesn't stop there. Jesus' self-sacrifice matters because it is how he expects all on the side of truth to respond. Listen to John 18:37. 'Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice.' What could that mean? Could it mean anything other than the change Jesus expects in us?

Self-sacrifice is the key. We have all had to adhere to so many things, regulations, guidance, lockdowns and so on. But it's the self sacrifices that stand out. As we move from lockdown, where so many NHS staff have died helping others, to war, where those willing to give up their lives for others have come from across the world to help Ukraine, it is the quality we often most admire, yet so often shy away from.

I hope you have been enjoying the series we have embarked on in John's gospel. It is certainly challenging to prepare and preach, but I hope it has been challenging to hear and reflect on too. Several of the preaching team and I have used Don Carson's commentary. Widely acknowledged as the best commentary on John. From 1991, Carson was research professor of New Testament at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, Chicago. While he was there a student came looking for him early in the day. Perhaps for help, perhaps to deliver an overdue paper, perhaps to excuse an incomplete paper. But Carson was nowhere to be found. Not in the staff room, or his study or the canteen. The story goes that the student found Carson cleaning the toilets. The cleaner was off sick and it wasn't below Carson to help out in such a menial task. I wonder what we might have done, even in that simple situation. What does it take to step into a situation that isn't ideal, but into which God has placed you to do something..... I'll keep saying it, he became like us so we could become like him, isn't just about eternal, heavenly life, but so that we could know God in the difficult and messy life which needs his love too. How might Easter change you this year?

ST JOHN'S ECO NEWS

If you have come into church from the car park recently you might have noticed that the compost area has been given a makeover. The old wooden bins have been shut down and we are now using enclosed plastic ones instead. The wooden bins will be removed once everything in them has composted. In future we will only compost materials which break down easily with everything else going to the tip.

We realise that going from wood to plastic may not seem very 'eco' but there are several benefits. The wooden 'just throw everything in' bins took a long time to compost and had become an eyesore. When they did eventually produce compost it was very good compost but far more than the church garden needed. We are trying to reduce the amount of kitchen and paper waste going into landfill in plastic bin liners - enclosed bins mean we can compost vegetable waste without attracting vermin and shredded paper/paper towels without it blowing around the carpark.

So, if you are working in the church garden, please put grass cuttings and weeds into the plastic bin marked as being in use. Once that one is full move over to an empty one but please swap the labels over. If you are able, please take twigs, leaves, hedge trimmings and any other woody bits to the tip, otherwise put them in the sack. There are spare sacks in the black bin with no lid.
